**Lutherans Restoring Creation** ([www.lutheransrestoringcreation.org](http://www.lutheransrestoringcreation.org)) is a grassroots program designed to encourage the ELCA to incorporate care for creation into its full life and mission at all expressions – congregationally, synodically and nationally. *Resources include a manual to “green” your congregation and the Energy Stewards program to help congregations reduce their energy use, cut costs and protect the environment.*

**Creation Justice Ministries** ([www.creationjustice.org](http://www.creationjustice.org)) educates, equips and mobilizes Orthodox and Christian communions/denominations, congregations and individuals to protect and restore God's creation. Based on the priorities of its members, with a particular concern for the vulnerable and marginalized, this ministry provides collaborative opportunities to build ecumenical community, guides people of faith and faith communities towards eco-justice transformations, and raises a collective witness in the public arena echoing Christ's call for just relationships among all of creation. *Resources include annual “Earth Day Sunday” materials for reflection, education and worship.*

**Interfaith Power and Light** ([www.interfaithpowerandlight.org](http://www.interfaithpowerandlight.org)) is a faith-based response to climate change, helping congregations to respond through the promotion of energy conservation, energy efficiency and renewable energy and people of faith raise their voices in the policy-making arena to advance clean energy and limit carbon pollution. *There are IPL chapters in many states.*

**Earth Ministry** ([www.earthministry.org](http://www.earthministry.org)) is a faith-based organization in Washington state committed to engaging the Christian community in environmental stewardship. *Resources include a handbook for congregations engaging in creation care ministries.*

**Green Faith** ([www.greenfaith.org](http://www.greenfaith.org)) works to inspire, educate and mobilize people of diverse religious backgrounds for environmental leadership. *Programs include the “GreenFaith Certification” for congregations and the “Greenfaith Fellowship” program for individuals.*
