The glory of the Lord shall be revealed.



Where and how do you encounter God? Through the prophet Isaiah, God urges us to take comfort, trusting that "the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all people shall see it together" (Isaiah 40:5). At a time when our world bears the wounds of conflict, hunger and disaster, it can be challenging to uncover where and how God is at work. **Yet we know in faith that God is actively working in the world, transforming, reconciling, sustaining and inciting us to ever-greater acts of justice and mercy.**

In the season of **Advent**, we reflect on our biblical ancestors, waiting for the coming of the Messiah as they, too, longed for God to be revealed, "to lift up the lowly and fill the hungry with good things" (Luke 1:52-53). In the season of **Lent**, we remember the journey of the Hebrews, wandering through the wilderness toward their promised future, and the journey of Christ to the cross.

As we wait and watch during Advent and as we journey and seek in Lent, join ELCA World Hunger as we discern the ways we encounter the living God today. Through reflection on the stories of our biblical past and the stories of ministries responding to hunger and poverty today, we will explore together the many ways "the glory of the Lord" is revealed in communities that have come together to confront deep challenges with strength, hope and longing for a just world where all are fed.



STUDY GUIDES

Join ELCA World Hunger this Advent and Lent through study, reflection, prayer and worship. The 2023 Advent and 2024 Lent studies are full of new weekly devotions. Use these guides during weekly worship or adult study groups, in person or online, or encourage members to read it each week of the season at home.




Spread the word!




This guide is perfect for advocates and would-be advocates, congregations interested in developing housing ministries, and seasoned leaders looking for the next step in their ministry.

Learn, donate, advocate and pray to ensure access to clean water for all.




World Refugee Day




Share a pig, cow, chicken or other barnyard friend during a children's sermon or Sunday school class, teaching children about the difference an animal makes to a family in need.


NEW! "God's New Creation" VBS




