ADVENT LITANY

Use this litany in your worship service or include it in newsletters as you celebrate the season:

Congregation's responses are sung, with accompaniment or a capella, to the tune of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

Leader: In this season of waiting, we remember those bound by hunger and thirst and those who long to taste freedom — from want, from fear and from isolation. To God, who frees us, we pray:

Community: O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel.

Leader: In this season of anticipation, we groan with those who long for the banquet at which all will be fed. To God, who welcomes us, we pray:

Community: O come, O Wisdom from on high, embracing all things far and nigh.

Leader: In this season of watching, we walk with refugees and migrants, and remember our own long journey to the Promised Land. To God, who accompanies us, we pray:

Community: O come, O come, O Lord of might, as to your tribes on Sinai's height.

Leader: In this season of winter, we hear the cries of a newborn babe echoing in a stable and are moved by the cries echoing from the streets and alleyways, the shelters and viaducts of our own communities. To God, who wanders with us, we pray:


Community: O come, O Key of David, come, and open wide our heav'nly home.

Leader: In this season of hope, we work for peace, toward a world in which all lives have value. To God, who reconciles us, we pray:

Community: O come, O King of nations, come, O Cornerstone that binds in one.

Leader: In this season of expectation, we strive for justice, awaiting the One who brings good news to the poor and sets the captives free. To God, who calls us, we pray:

Community: O come, O Dayspring, come and cheer, O Sun of justice, now draw near.

ADVENT TREE

Whether decorating a tree at home or in your church's gathering space, families can hang ornaments as a reminder of their giving. Adorn a tree with ornaments that represent ELCA Good Gifts as well as your congregation's fundraising goal. Invite families to select ornaments representing the gifts they'd like to give and to take them home as a reminder of their giving. If you have multiple entrances or gathering spaces, consider using several trees. Keep each tree full of ornaments to encourage participation and to celebrate the work we're doing with the whole church!








FORGOTTEN LUTHER II LUTHER

This collection of essays from leading Lutheran thinkers, theologians and activists excavates Martin Luther's theological focus on social and economic justice. By bringing these "forgotten" elements of Reformation theology to light, it helps contemporary heirs of Luther's thought to honor and advance this neglected part of his legacy by responding to the economic and social injustices of our own time.

In The Forgotten Luther II: Reclaiming the Church's Public Witness, Lutheran scholars argue for a clear, cogent, biblically based and theologically grounded rationale for how the church speaks and acts in the political arena. This essay anthology looks carefully at the public witness of Martin Luther and its meaning for preaching, teaching and carrying out public ministry today. Luther was convinced that government is responsible to God for containing evil and maintaining peace and good order, and for ensuring that no person lives in hunger or want.

The essays ask critical questions: When should the church support the state's agenda? When should it resist? What are the options for critical but constructive cooperation?

The Forgotten Luther II comes with discussion questions to guide reflection, and video interviews with the authors are available online.



Pair the activities with an ELCA Good Gifts fundraiser to support ELCA World Hunger's animal projects.






STICKERS

Distribute these coloring-sheet bulletin inserts to children during worship or Sunday school. The back side of the coloring sheet provides pictures and information about each animal.



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
ACT 2DAY 4 TOMORROW


