

UPDATES on Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA

Thanks to the support of ELCA congregations and members, a new class of students, future pastors and young-adult volunteers will begin studies or service over the next couple of months.

 In August, 93 young adults embarked on a year of international service with the Young Adults in Global Missian program. Serving in one of 11 country programs, the volunteers grow in faith and self-understanding as they engage in relationship and service with local host communities. Service placements vary widely, from congregational and youth ministry to alternative education and health and development projects. development projects.



- This fall, seven women from our global companion churches will begin studies at ELCA colleges,
 universities and seminaries through the <u>International Women Leaders</u> initiative. After their studies,
 these women will return to their home countries ready to assume important leadership roles in
 church and society from becoming a bishop to winning the Nobel Peace Prize. With the addition of
 the incoming class, 24 international women have received scholarships to study at ELCA institutions
 through this initiative since 2015.
- During the 2017-2018 academic year, the <u>ELCA Fund for Leaders</u> is providing 245 students with
 more than \$2 million in seminary scholarships. The <u>ELCA Fund for Leaders</u> enables us to attract
 men and women of tremendous promise to become pastors and rostered lay leaders and to study at
 an <u>ELCA Seminary</u>. The fund is the ongoing promise of this church that candidates for ministry will
 have the opportunity to pursue a path toward informed faith and passionate discipleship.
