It's funny how that happens, and I'm sure that's happened to you. But then I was also thinking about the end of the Gospel according to Mark. Where the women, once they hear the news of Jesus' resurrection, just stood there in fear and trembling. They come to a cemetery, expecting death. And now this amazing announcement had happened. In the Greek it says, *ékstasis*—standing at a different place, standing next to or outside of oneself. We get the word "ecstasy" from that.

It turns out that the women had come to the right place at the wrong time. That the time was not the time of death.

And it turns out that I'm here in the chapel in the right place. Just as we all are in our right places when we recognize and feel and allow the presence of God to be completely surrounding us. So wherever you are in the world, God is with you.
